Bus Travel- Important Message

Bus travel in the afternoon still seems to be an effort for some children. These children struggle with the discipline to sit quietly for 15 minutes and not to disturb others. The bus driver has a difficult job driving the bus safely if the children are distracting him by their bad behaviour. Please discuss this matter with your child. Children who repeatedly misbehave will be suspended from using the bus. The school will take further action to make sure our children remain safe. We want every child to home safely and hope you understand this important message.

Canberra Excursion 5th 6th and 7th November 2014 Years 4, 5 and 6

The Canberra is a very exciting and well planned excursion. Parents may commence making payments of \$30 a week if this helps budget for the event. The total cost is \$330. Although in the past some children have been given a small amount of spending money although this is not necessary. The cost covers their accommodation, all meals, entry into all activities and the bus. To help train the children to value this expense you might like to encourage them to save pocket money or to do additional jobs around their home.
