Aisha—for smashing goals in Maths.

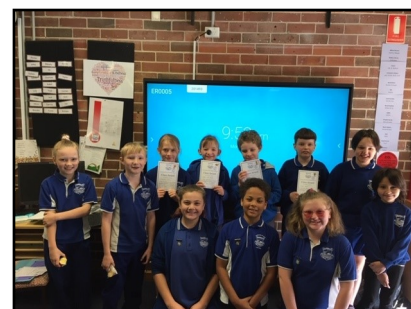
Clark—for demonstrating pride in his writing.
