### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT:

Dear Parents,

**Meet and Greet:** Next week we will hold our meet the teacher information sessions. These will be on either Tuesday or Wednesday depending on the class your child is in. Please see the attached flyer for session times. This is a great opportunity to meet with your child's teacher to find out more about what your child will be learning this year and to find out ways to support them. We look forward to seeing you.

**Morning Drop Off:** Morning drop offs can be a stressful time for both parent and child. To encourage great habits, we suggest the following. Drop your child at school at least 10 minutes before the 9:10 bell. Either drop your child off and leave straight away or walk them in and settle them onto the playground. As soon as they start to play, leave with only a quick goodbye. This helps both the child as they become less worked up and emotional, particularly if they do not separate well, and assists the teacher with getting children into classes quickly so that lessons may commence.

**Afternoon Pick-ups:** Please remember to wait at the gate for collection. When your child sees you out of the classroom window in the afternoon, they lose focus on the messages the teacher is trying to give them. Thank you for assisting us in this area.

**No Standing/Parking Areas:** Please note that the small section in front of the crossing on Greenwell Point Road is a no parking/stopping area. Parents have been fined in the past by police and parking officers for using this area. The safest drop off/ pick up areas are in Jervis Street and Church Street.

**Covid and Stomach Bugs:** At present we have several Covid cases present in the school. We have also been sending home children with stomach bugs. Please keep your child home if they are exhibiting any signs or symptoms of both and/or complaining of feeling unwell. Please also contact the school to notify them your child is sick. Let's contain the outbreaks early by working together. If you require any Covid testing kits, please contact the office and we can arrange for some to be sent home. Please note that remote home learning packages are no longer sent home. If you require work for your child while they are home, then please refer to the NSW Dept of Education Remote/Home learning website.

**Swimming Carnival:** On Tuesday, 14 students represented our school in the Small Schools Swimming Carnival at Bomaderry Aquatic Centre. Students were selected to compete at the carnival through timed trials which took place last year at our In-school Swimming Carnival.
